



Hanseatic Marine: Construction of a series of 70+ metre SOLAS vessels

AMC tenant and premier superyacht builder, Hanseatic Marine, has a long-term agreement to lease the CUF's Building 9 fabrication hall and are currently focused on the construction of a series of 70+ metre SOLAS vessels.

In May 2007, Hanseatic launched the spectacular 74 metre superyacht, Silver, the world's longest aluminium hulled private motor yacht. The vessel's slender lines and sleek profile are a departure from the ever 'higher and wider' trend in current yacht design resulting in a highly efficient and eco-friendly hull form.

Powered by two 16V-4000 MTU engines, Silver, has a top speed of 25 knots and features a number of cutting edge features including "gull wing" hull doors that house two eight metre tender boats.

Silver was launched at the AMC Common User facility after two years of construction in one of the facilities fabrication halls. Hanseatic Marine is continuing to utilise the Fabrication Precinct to build two more vessels at the Common User Facility.
