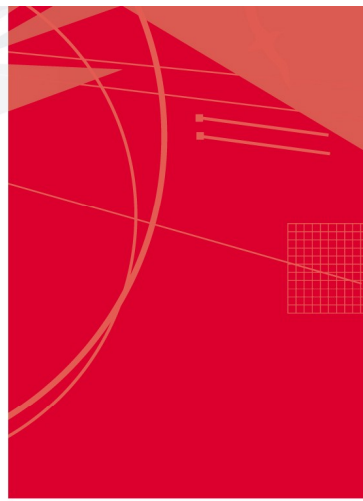

AGC: Jacket for New Zealand's Pohokura gas field (2006)

AGC utilised the Common User Facility's (CUF) large fabrication hall for the assembly of a jacket structure for Shell Todd's Pohokura gas field in New Zealand.

The jacket - approximately 56 metre high on a base measuring 16 metre by 16 metre - was manufactured from tubular steel sub sections constructed at AGC's Kwinana workshop and transported by road to the CUF via the High Wide Load Corridor.

The fabrication hall heavy lift 150 tonne gantry crane was crucial in achieving the program.

The jacket is Australia's first ever export oil and gas jacket and was successfully loaded on the MV Annegret bound for New Zealand at the start of February 2006.

The jacket is used at the offshore Pohokura well site in conjunction with the Ensco Rig 56 jack-up.

The rig will drill six production wells to complement the three deviated onshore production wells and one water injection well that the Ensign Rig 41 is finishing drilling from the coast.
